Education Psychologist Visit

Megan Colahan has had a long association with our school and worked with many students, parents and teachers in recent years.

Megan's 2016 visit will be on Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th of April. Megan will work with identified students and your child's class teacher will discuss this with you if they have reason to believe your child could benefit from working with Megan.

Megan will also run at least one parent information session to discuss latest research on positive parenting and to be available to answer any questions you may have.

Teacher identified students will have priority during Megan's visit; however, if you have any concerns regarding you child and wish to inquire about any benefit of them working with Megan please talk to your child's class teacher to discuss these concerns so that a decision can be made as to whether a follow up appointment is necessary.

It is important to understand that there is no benefit in having a child tested if there is not clear evidence that the child requires testing and assessment – this testing is used to support the implementation of significant learning interventions and your child's teacher will be able to provide you with the most up to date data and information regarding your child's learning progress.

ISOS has followed up weekend Mantoux testing and sent all blood tests to Port Moresby. If you have any concerns regarding your health or that of your child please make an appointment for a consultation at the Lihir Medical Centre so that medical professionals are able to support you and your family.
